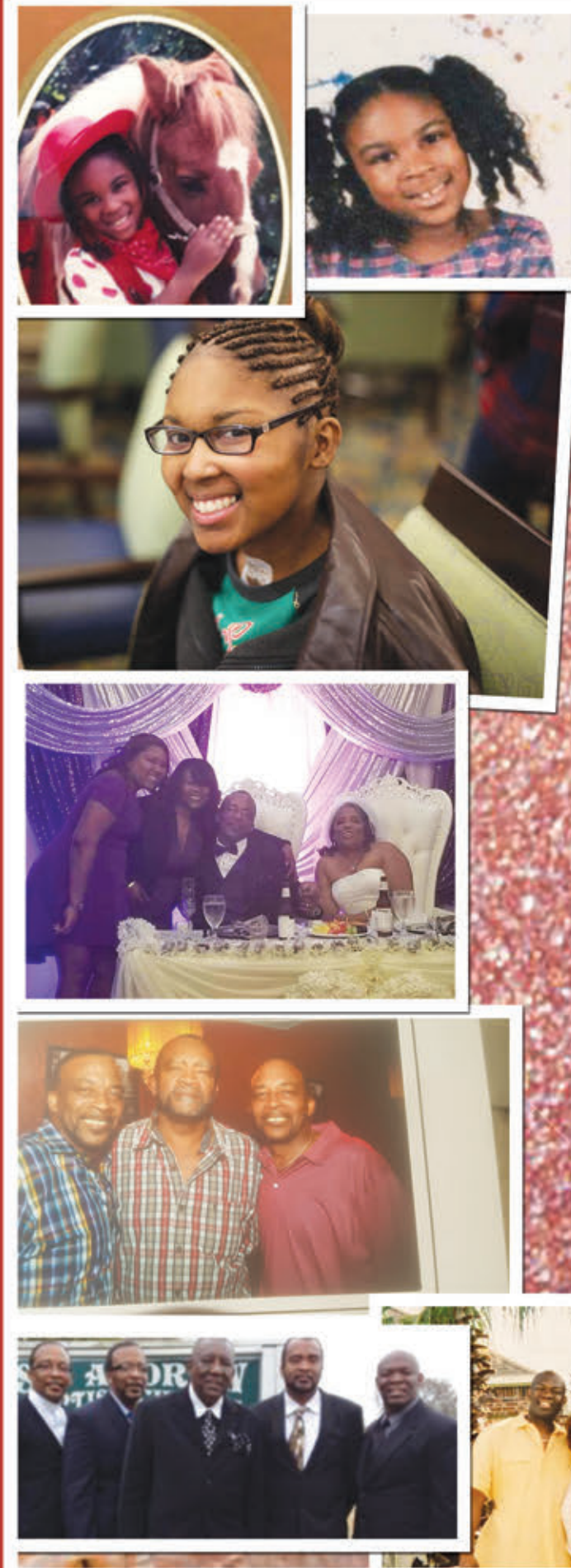
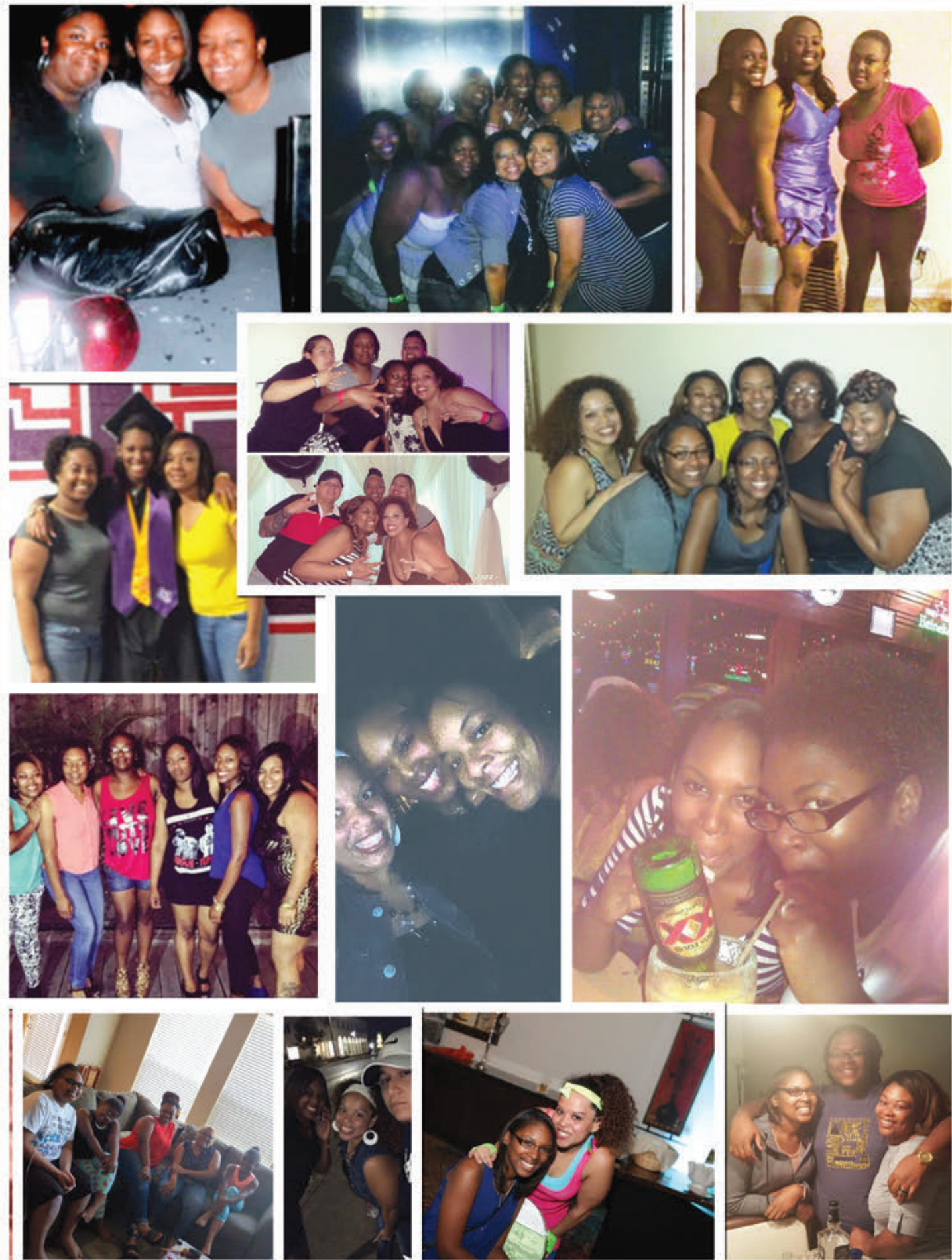
She worked at Eye to Eye as an Optometrist Assistant until her health declined.
