OBITUARY

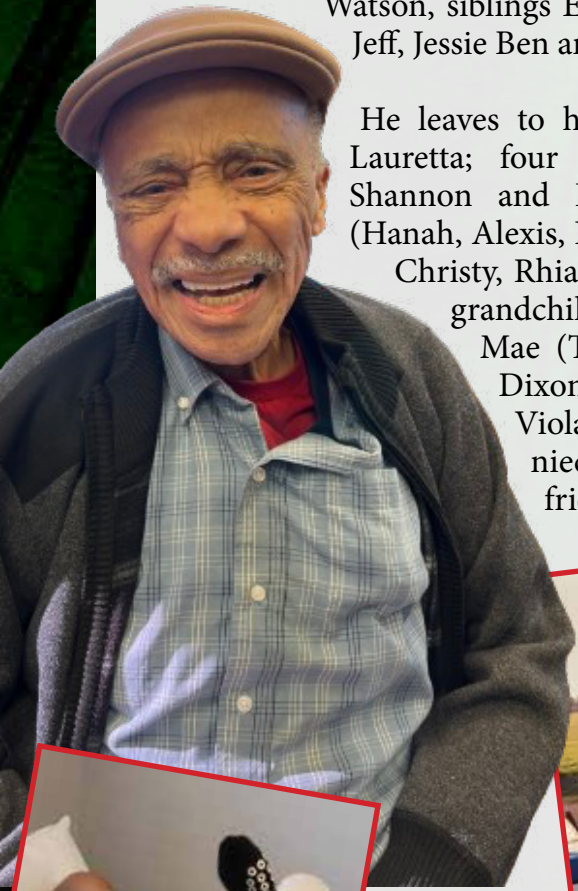
