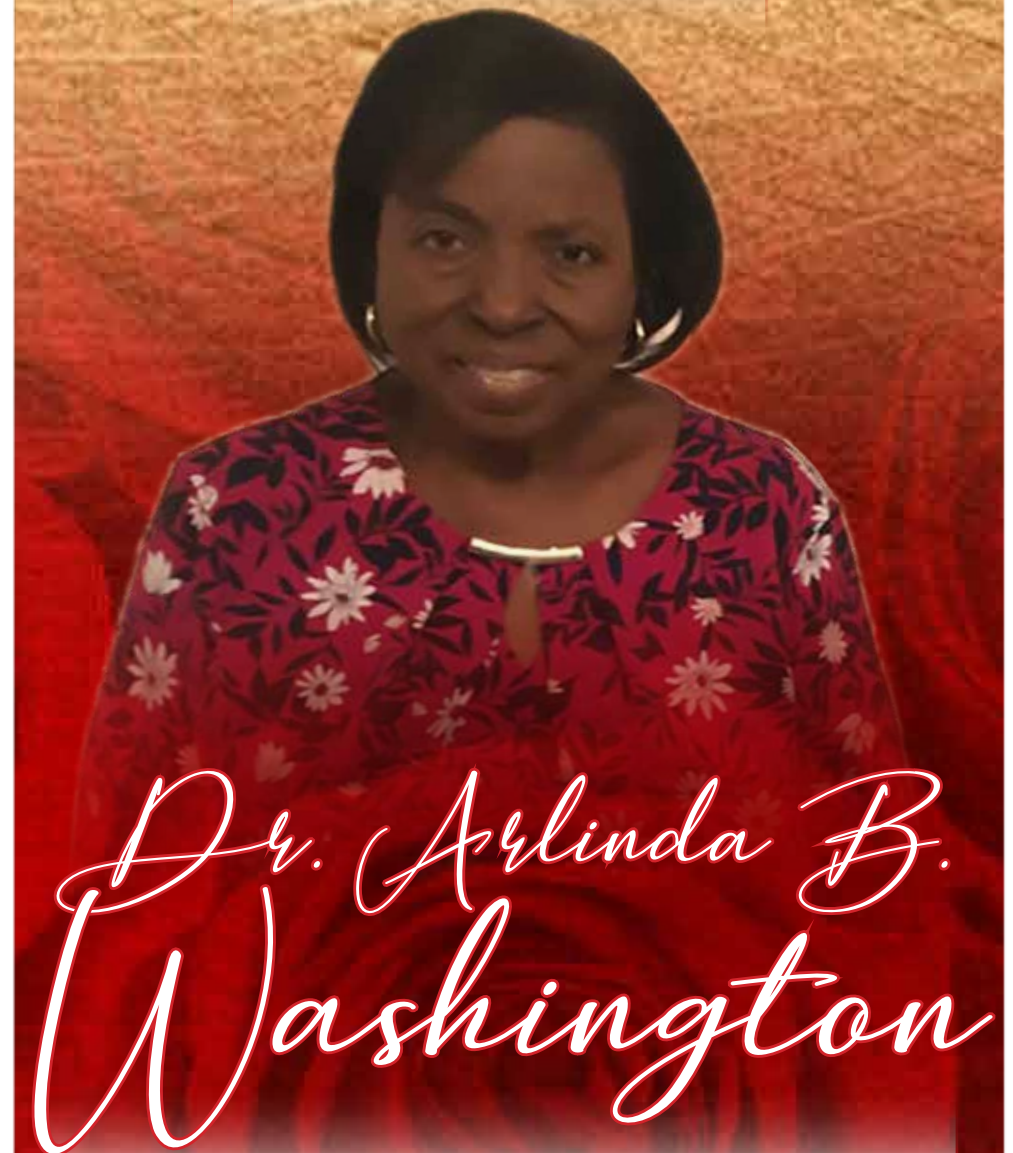

Arlinda's Life

Dr. Arlinda B. Washington passed away peacefully on September 12, 2022, at the tender age of 77 years. Arlinda was born on November 20, 1944, in Texas City, Texas to Pomeroy and Annie Coleman.

She graduated from Lincoln High School in La Marque, Texas in 1961 and then began her extensive college and university affiliations by matriculating at Alvin Community College where she earned her certification as a nurse's aide, followed by certification as a licensed vocational nurse, and then licensing as a registered nurse with an associate degree in nursing. Arlinda was a determined person and a hard worker – she worked as a registered nurse full time (with two young children) while she continued to attend classes at UTMB in Galveston. She graduated from UTMB with her bachelor's degree in nursing in 1974. The thirst for learning and growing remained with Arlinda as she earned her master's degree in nursing from the University of Portland in 1991. Since Arlinda loved to help people, she expanded her professional life in Yakima, Washington to include service as a nursing instructor while continuing to work as a nurse. Upon moving back to Texas in 1994, she began to teach nursing at several local junior colleges (San Jacinto Junior College, College of the Mainland, Galveston College) and online universities. Again, the thirst for learning and growing remained with her as she soon began to work on her doctorate later in life. Through sheer grit, resilience, and perseverance, Arlinda graduated in 2015 from Chamberlain University with her Doctor of Nursing Practice at age 70 – that was an amazing accomplishment. If one does the math, Dr. Arlinda Washington faithfully served as a healer and teacher for almost 60 years.

Dr. Washington was known by family, friends, and colleagues as a person full of energy, verve vitality, hope, graciousness, and kindness. She believed in the power of positive thinking and responding to challenges with a "yes we can" approach. She was always willing to help. Did she write a recommendation letter for you? Did she cover a class for you? Did she pay for your lunch? Did she attend your wedding or birthday party? Did she send you a greeting card out of the blue? Did she visit you in the hospital? Did she proofread your paper for you? Did she call you just to say hello and check on you? Did she just listen when you needed a listening ear? Dr. Washington dedicated her life to service. Many people that met her over the last 20 years had no idea that she was battling cancer the entire time. She never complained – she just carried on and held her head high as she served others.

Arlinda is preceded in death by her parents, Pomeroy and Annie Coleman, her son, Kevin Hicks, her sister, Annie Faye Coleman, and her brother, Dellaneo Coleman. She is survived by her husband, Charles Washington, her son, Gilbert Hicks, her brother, Lee Roy Coleman, and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, and cousins.
