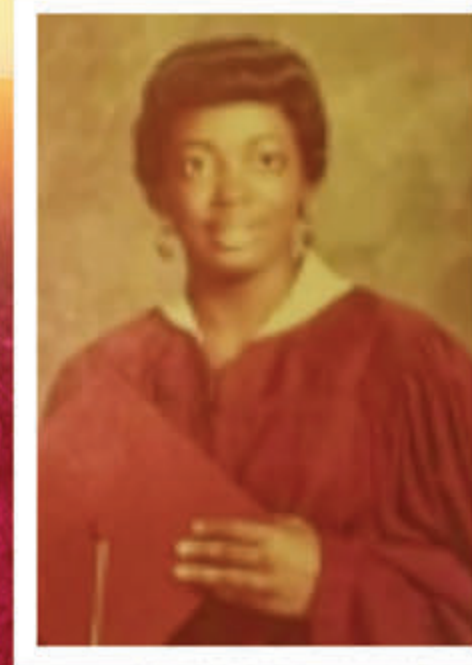
On June 9, 1979, Barbara Louise Johnson and James Robert Mills were united in Holy matrimony. During this union, their two children were born.

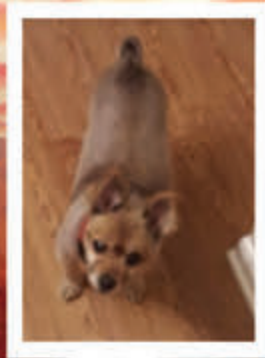
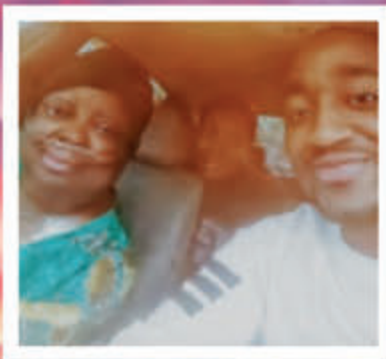
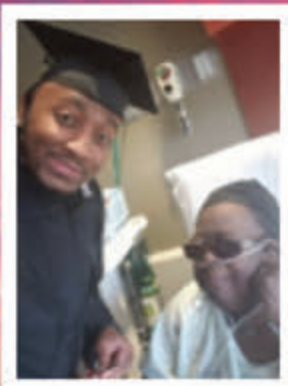
She was preceded in death by her brother James Samuel Johnson Jr and her father James Samuel Johnson Sr.
