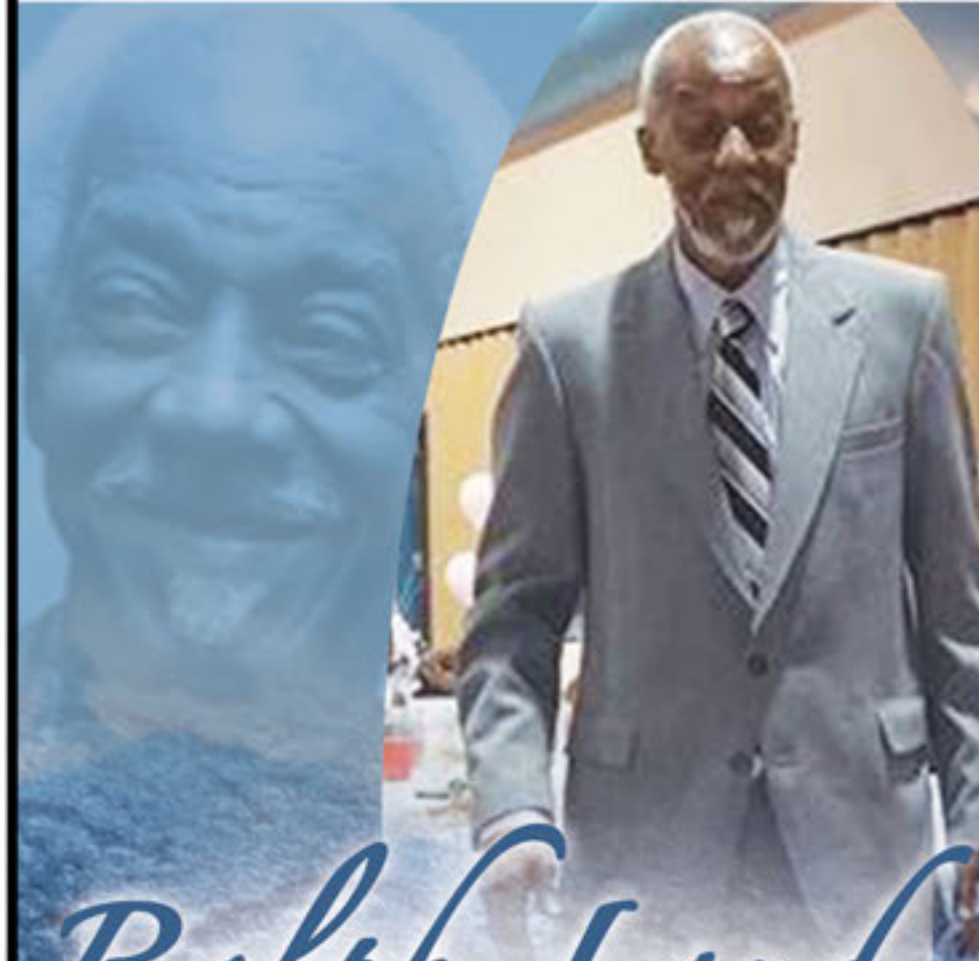

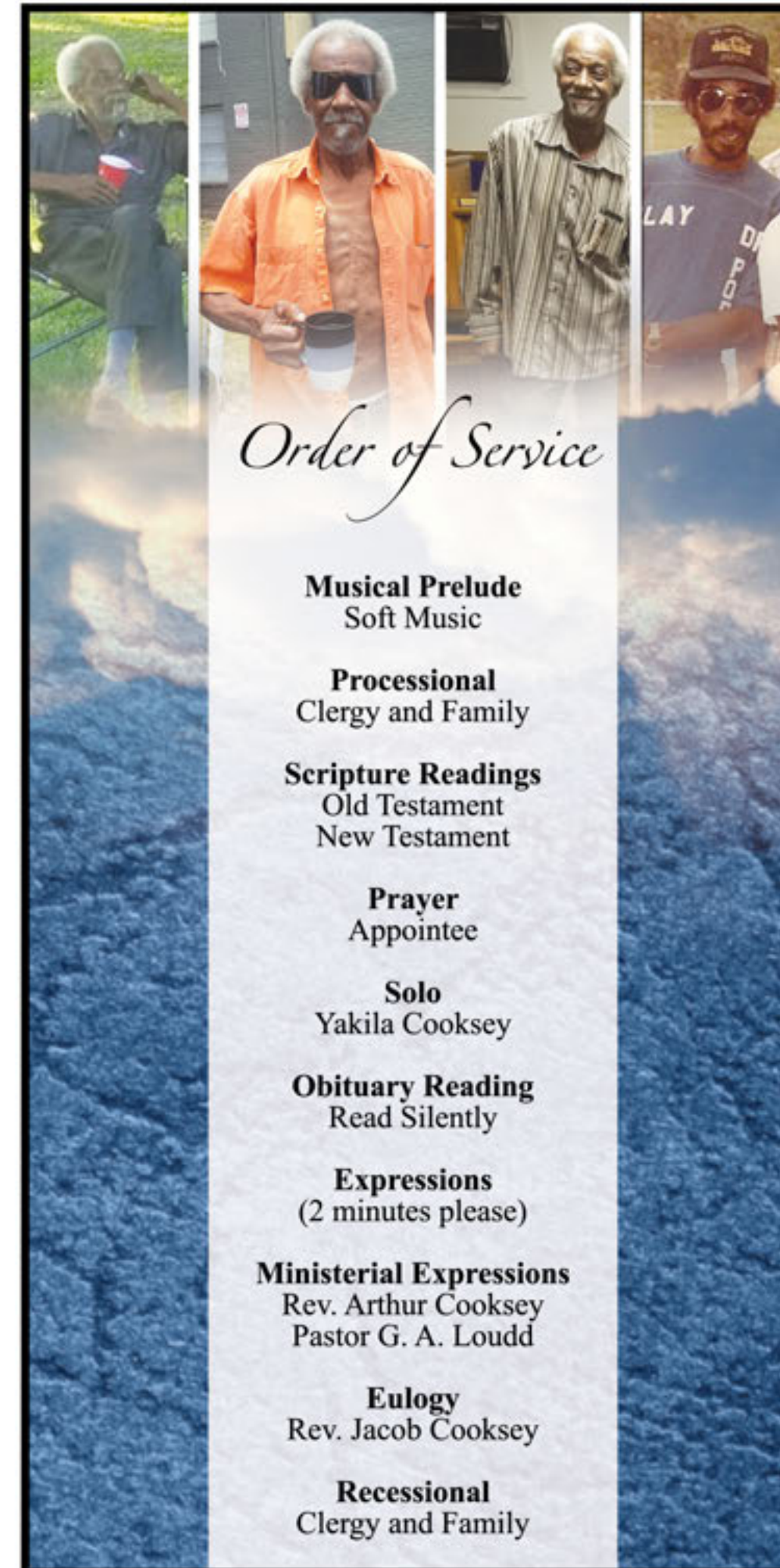
Obituary
