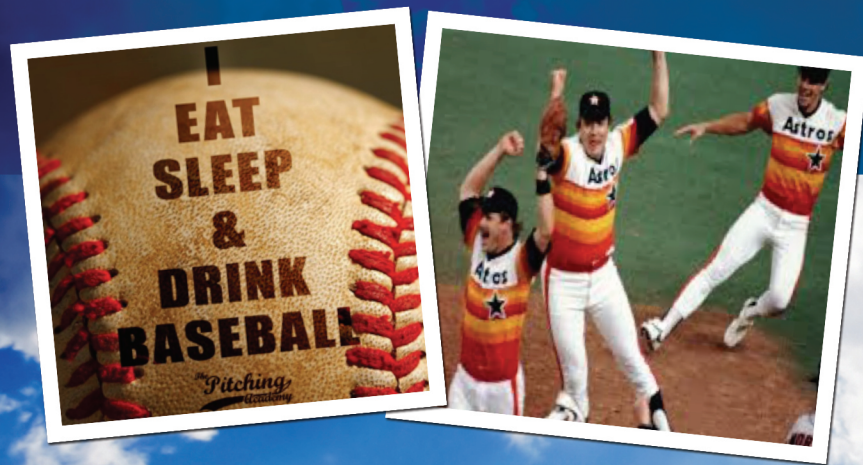


Tribute

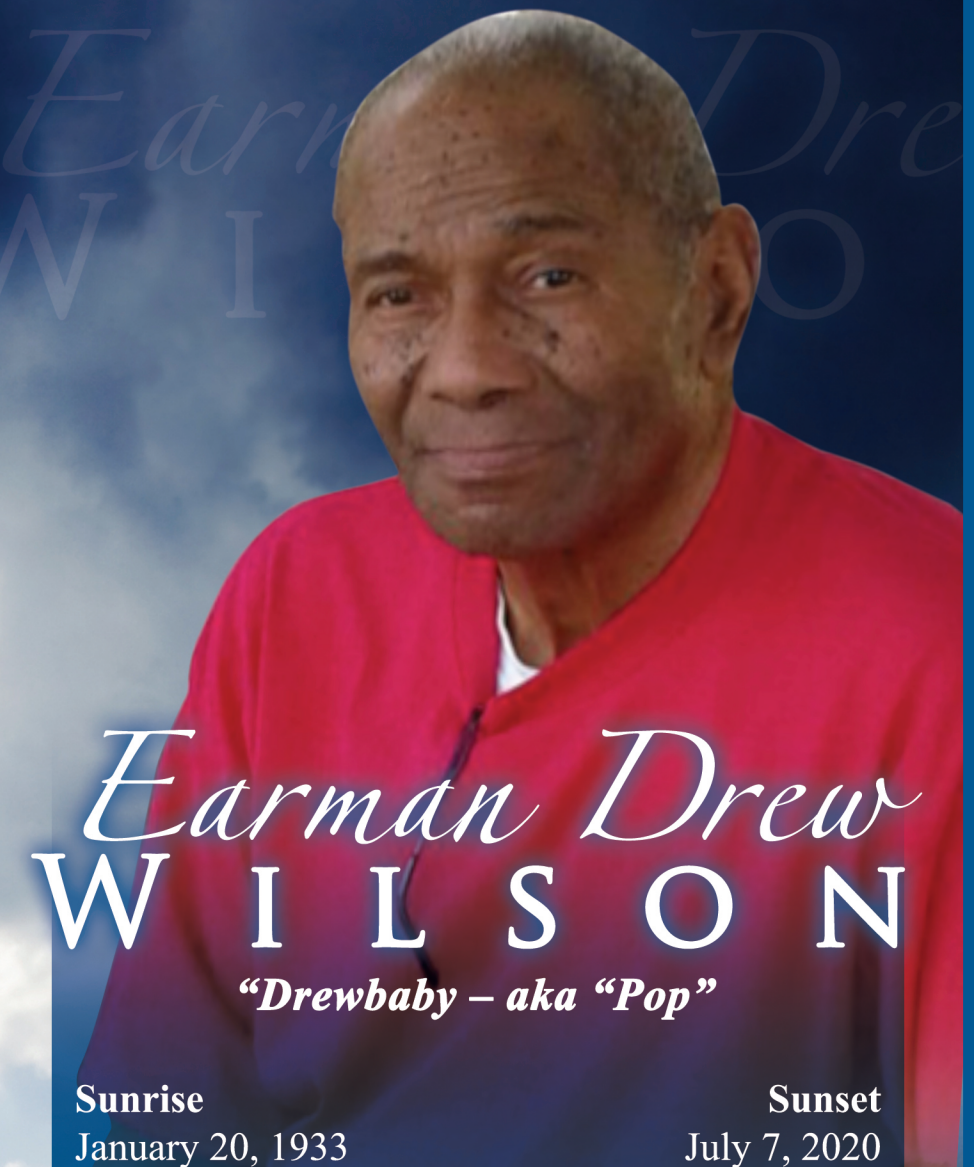

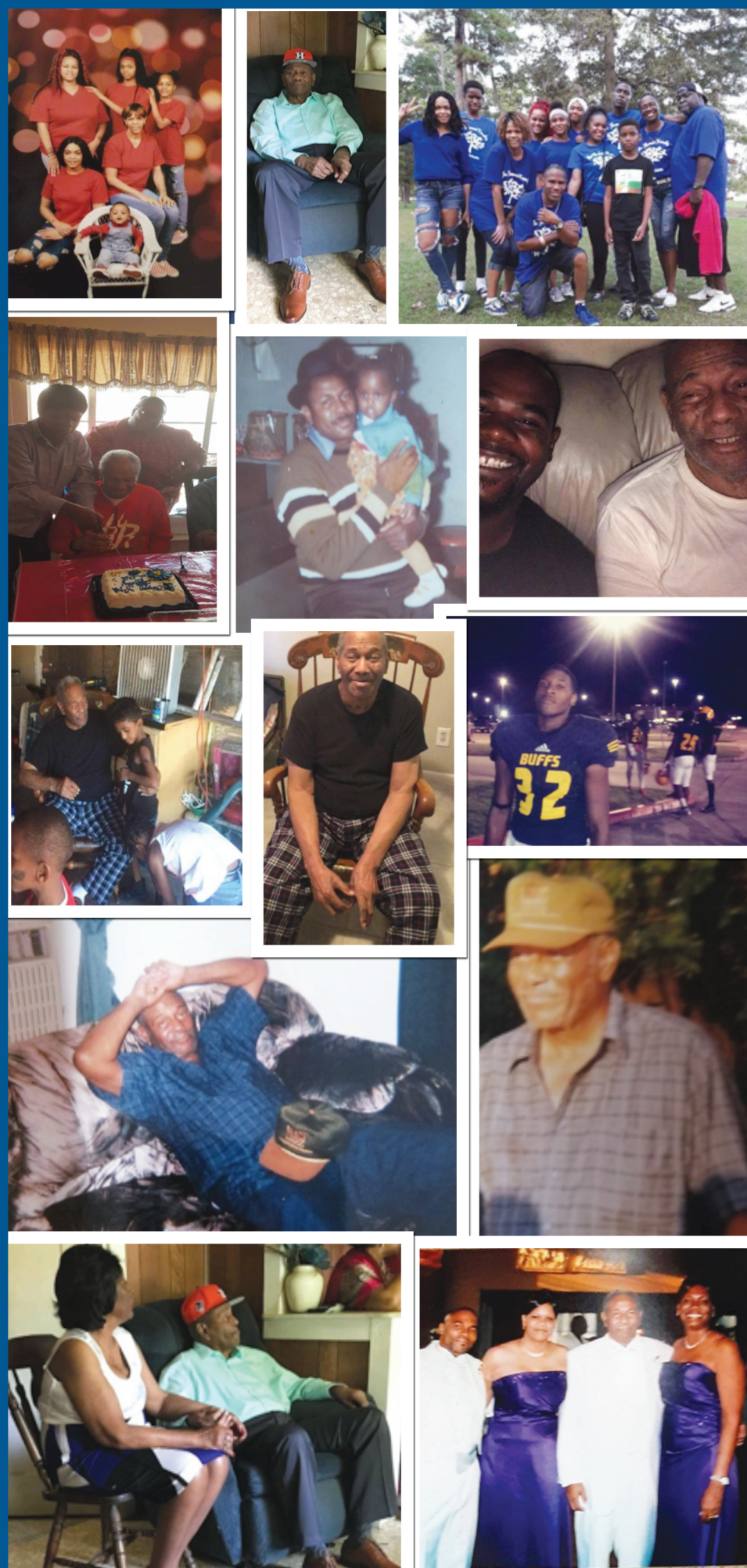

Obituary

Earman Drew Wilson, (aka 'Pop' / 'Drewbaby') was born in Minden, Louisiana to the Union of Earnest Wilson and Rose Webb on January 20th, 1933. His mother died when he was just a little boy; he is preceded in death by his father, other siblings, family members – who loved him dearly & friends.

Growing up as a young boy – he was called “Drew”. Drew professed Christ at a young age, being baptized and singing in the Church Choir, which help to shape his heart for his life’s journey. Drew packed up his bags and told his Daddy that he was going to Texas. His daddy made him work in the lumber yard for three- months, to save money for his journey. Drew set out on his journey and moved to Texas – for what he thought was a better life – and yes indeed it turned out to be. Drew moved to Houston, Texas at the age of seventeen in 1950. He wandered around from job to job, until at the age 22, he became a Truck-Driver for “U.S. Plywood Trucking Company”, driving 18-wheelers, hauling lumber/plywood for over 50-years – all over the state of Texas. A job that he loved with all his heart, that which gave him dignity and honor; it was a pleasure for him to drive all over the State of Texas – contributing his part to building this great state of Texas that we now live in today.

Many loved him and many will miss him, he became known as “Drew-baby” to all his friends in the community of Clinton-view, Clinton Park & Fidelity. He resided at 406 Tennessee for 33 years, where he became to be known as “Pop” to all his children, grandchildren, and close relatives. “Pop” will 4-ever be known as a giving man and a man with a good heart – He will be truly missed.
